

NOTE: The following two methods for distributing AutoCAD Civil 3D 2010 Subscription Advantage Pack apply only to **administrative images** created with the AutoCAD Civil 3D 2010 Network Installation Wizard. After you complete these procedures, any new deployments of AutoCAD Civil 3D 2010 will include the Subscription Advantage Pack.

Appending the Civil 3D 2010 Subscription Advantage Pack to an Existing Administrative Image

This method applies to an existing administrative image that has been appended with SP2

1. From the Autodesk Subscription Support website, download the Subscription Pack executable to the administrative image `\AdminImage\x86\ServicePacks` folder.
2. Browse to the administrative image `\AdminImage\` folder and open the administrative image INI file in Notepad (the one named `<deployment name>.ini`, not `AdminImage.ini`).
3. In the C3D Prerequisite section, append the section with the following:
[SAP]
PRODUCT_NAME=Civil 3D 2010 Subscription Advantage Pack
EXE_PATH=ServicePacks\C3D_2010_Sub.exe
EXE_PARAM=/q
IGNORE_FAILURE=YES
4. In the C3D section, update the Postrequisite variable to:
POSTREQUISITE=SAP
5. Save the INI file with a new name
6. In your administrative image's root folder, copy the existing administrative image shortcut and rename it to match the modified INI file.
7. Right click on the new shortcut, select Properties and update the Target field to match the modified INI file.

Merging the Civil 3D 2010 Subscription Advantage Pack to an Existing Administrative Image

This method applies to an existing administrative image that has been merged with SP2.

NOTE: Before merging AutoCAD Civil 3D 2010 Subscription Advantage Pack to the existing AutoCAD Civil 3D 2010 Service Pack 2 administrative image, **ensure that all client machines have already been updated** with the Subscription Advantage Pack.

In the following procedure, the update file that you download contains two MSP (Microsoft Patch) files. You must extract those files from the executable file. To extract the MSP file from the executable, use the `/e` ("extract") switch.

1. From the Autodesk Subscription Support website, download `C3D_2010_Sub.exe` to your local computer.
2. On the Start menu (Windows), click Run. Enter the following information, and then click OK.

```
<local drive>:\C3D_2010_Sub.exe /e <local  
drive>:\C3D_2010_Sub.msp
```

3. Copy the two MSP files to the administrative image `\AdminImage\x86\ServicePacks` folder.
4. On the Start menu (Windows), click Run. Enter the following information, and then click OK.

```
msiexec /qb- /a <deployment  
location>\AdminImage\x86\C3D\c3d.msi /p <deployment  
location>\AdminImage\x86\ServicePacks\C3D_2010_Sub  
_Glob.msp
```

5. On the Start menu (Windows), click Run. Enter the following information, and then click OK.

```
msiexec /qb- /a <deployment  
location>\AdminImage\x86\C3D\c3d.msi /p <deployment  
location>\AdminImage\x86\ServicePacks\C3D_2010_Sub  
_lp.msp
```
