1.4 What are the differences between the student product versions available for free² on the Student Community and the ones for sale?

Both versions are student licensed for personal learning and provide output with an education watermark.

Free student versions have a 13-month license term of use. Most purchased licenses of 2010 student versions provide an academic career license term of use (61 months) and have a preferred upgrade discount to a full commercial version upon graduation or at least 18 months after license purchase.

1.6 Are the new suites available for student purchase?

No, the new Autodesk Education Suites are available for sale only to academic institutions. Students may obtain free³ versions of Autodesk products via the Autodesk Student Engineering and Design Community (www.autodesk.com/edcommunity) or purchase licenses of student versions from their local Autodesk Authorized Academic Reseller (www.autodesk.com).

3. Selecting a Product Suite

3.1 What are the benefits of the new Education Suites?

The new Education Suites provide a consistent bundled application offering worldwide, with aggressive pricing discounts, streamlined purchasing, and an easier product installation and activation process. In addition, you now have the option of adding Autodesk® Subscription and support to your Education Suite license purchase for access to all Subscription services and benefits.

3.2 How do I determine which Education Suite is right for my school?

If you work in a secondary school, the Autodesk Design Academy has a set of products and pricing designed for your needs with freely available curricula

(English only, imperial measurement only) on the Autodesk Education Community site designed to support science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) concepts appropriate for this learning level.

For postsecondary institutions, the new industry-oriented Education Suites align well with the academic major or department responsible for educating students in the concepts and techniques used in those industries.

Schools with multiple departments using Autodesk technology and curricula or that provide cross-disciplinary programs may consider the efficiency of choosing the Education Master Suite, which includes the complete set of Autodesk Education Suite products.

3.3 Are curricula and teacher materials included in the Education Suites?

4. Purchasing an Autodesk Education Suite

4.1 How are the Autodesk Education Suites sold?

Autodesk Education Suites are available from your local Autodesk Authorized Academic Reseller. To find the reseller nearest you, visit www.autodesk.com.

Academic institutions can purchase licenses in a variety of configurations with flexible licensing terms designed to meet the needs of the smallest classroom to the largest multisite university system.

Autodesk offers institutions and schools affordable pricing on Autodesk software, curricula, and training, including significant volume discounts.

4.2 Under what type of license do the Education Suites operate?

Autodesk Education Suites are governed by the terms of the software license agreement that appears when installing the software, including the Educational Institutional Version terms of the license agreement. Suites are not licensed to be used for commercial, professional, commercial training, or other for-profit purposes.

4.3 Can I buy a perpetual license for the Education Suites?

Yes, Autodesk Education Suites are generally available in both one-year term and perpetual license forms.⁴

4.4 Can I buy an annual term license for the Education Suites?

Yes, Autodesk Education Suites are available in either one-year term or perpetual license forms.⁵

4.5 Can I install the Education Suites using stand-alone or network licensing?

Yes, the Education Suites can be installed using either stand-alone or network licensing. The license pack of Education Suites can be designated as stand-alone or network licensed. For more information on licensing options, visit www.autodesk.com/licensing.

4.6 How does stand-alone licensing of Education Suites work?

When a customer purchases a specific volume license pack, for instance a 25-license pack of the Civil & Structural Engineering Suite, the customer can install all applications, one application, or any combination of the applications in the suite on a maximum of 25 unique computers. As soon as one application is installed and activated, the number of available activations is decremented. In this example, this means that customers can activate 25 licenses of AutoCAD on 25 computers and can also install and use Autodesk Inventor or any of the other applications in the suite on those same computers. However, the customer

cannot then install and activate Inventor or any of the other applications in the suite on 25 other computers. Once all 25 license activations are used on 25 computers, the customer will not be able to activate the suite or any of the applications in the suite on any additional computers without purchasing additional licenses.

4.7 How does network licensing of Education Suites work?

When a customer purchases a specific volume license pack, for instance a 25-license pack of the Civil & Structural Engineering Suite, the customer can install all applications, one application, or any combination of the applications in the suite on an unlimited number of computers up to amount of the licenses purchased. As soon as one application is launched, it will request a license from the network licensing server and if there are available licenses (up to 25 concurrent users), that user will receive a license, and the number of available licenses is decremented. In this example, this means that customers can simultaneously operate 25 licenses of AutoCAD on 25 computers. Or the customer could operate 12 licenses of AutoCAD and 13 licenses of Inventor concurrently. The customer cannot run any more than 25 concurrent computers with any application in the suite. Once the server has granted all 25 licenses, the customer will not be able to run any other application until a current user exits the application and returns a license to the network server pool.

4.8 What configurations of network licensing server are supported?

The Autodesk Education Suites support three types of network licensing:

1. Single network licensing server
2. Distributed network licensing servers
3. Redundant network licensing servers

5. Localization

5.1 Are the Education Suites localized in languages other than English?

Yes, Autodesk Education Suites are shipped in localized versions where available. All localized products available in a particular language or group of languages ship in a localization language binder.

Please note that not every application in every suite is available in each language. In cases where a localized version of an application is not available, an English language version will be substituted.

The specific localization language binders available are:

- Japanese (kanji)
- Asia (contains any applications available in Korean, Simplified Chinese, and Traditional Chinese)

6.5 Can I get Subscription with phone support?

Autodesk Gold Subscription, which provides phone support, is available as an incremental option for customers in North America only. Phone support may not be available for every product in each suite.

6.6 Can I still get support if my school didn't purchase Subscription?

Yes, academic institutions that purchase Autodesk Education Suites are entitled to 30 days of support from the date of registration, covering installation and configuration via the Up & Ready support program.

In addition, technical support and product usage assistance will be made available via the public Autodesk.com knowledge base and forums, the Student Engineering and Design Community forums, and email on an as-available basis.

6.7 My school has one of Autodesk's previous education product bundles. Will we need to change?

Education customers with active contracts on any previous bundles or offerings will receive the product releases or upgrades due based on the terms of their license. Work with your reseller to determine your contract status and, as appropriate, to help identify the new Education Suite and configuration that works best for your school.

6.8 What is Autodesk product retirement policy for education products?

For most individually offered products for education and students, Autodesk provides the most current shipping release only. Older releases are retired. So, most 2009 individual releases will be retired by August 2009, as the 2010 versions are released.

Education Suites will be offered in current release versions only. Prior 2009 bundles worldwide will be retired from the education offering starting in August 2009.

Section Two: Autodesk Student Engineering and Design Community

This document answers frequently asked questions about the Autodesk Student Engineering and Design Community for faculty and students.

1 What is the Student Community website?

The Student Community is an online community where students and educators can download free* software, find valuable learning resources, and connect with people and jobs. To learn more, visit www.autodesk.com/edcommunity.

2 I've registered on the Student Community website, but I have never received an email confirming my access. What should I do?

If your school email system has strong email SPAM blockers, emails sent from Autodesk may have been rerouted. Check your email filter and talk to your school's IT department about accepting emails from studentcommunity@autodesk.com.

3 How do I change my email or other contact information for the Student Community website?

Log on to the Student Community and go to My Profile to change your data and notifications. If you think you provided the wrong information because you haven't received your account activation email, send an email to studentcommunity@autodesk.com.

4 Can I access the Student Community website even if I am not a student?

No. You need to be a student or faculty member participating in a valid academic program at the secondary or postsecondary level in order to join the Student Community.

Secondary includes anyone from age 13 up to a postsecondary program. Postsecondary includes students in four-year colleges, two-year colleges, technical schools, postgraduate degree programs, and so forth.

5 I'm recently out of work. Do you have a program that would enable me to access and train on Autodesk products?

Yes, recently displaced employees seeking free* software and learning may be eligible to participate in the Autodesk Assistance Program. To learn more, visit www.autodesk.com/assistance.

6 Do I have to be actively enrolled in a school to participate in the Student Community?

Yes. Membership and logon privileges for graduating students and others not actively enrolled will expire.

7 I am an instructor and I have a group of students who are interested in joining the Student Engineering and Design Community. We do not have student email addresses for them. How can I get my students onto the community website using their own personal email addresses?

Faculty members can join the Student Community first and then invite their students by clicking the Invite link available to faculty only.

8 Are there free* Student Versions of Autodesk software available to students?

Yes. Visit www.autodesk.com/edcommunity to sign up and download more than 24 Autodesk software titles.

9 Where can students and faculty obtain Autodesk software titles that are not offered through the Student Community?

Autodesk offers a broad set of free* products on the Student Community. In a few cases, products that are not on the Student Community are available for purchase. Purchase from your school (if your school has student licensing) or from an Autodesk Academic Value Added Reseller. To locate a reseller go to www.autodesk.com/reseller

10 Are older versions of software available on the Student Community?

The Student Community offers current version plus one version back.

11 Can the same student install a product on two different computers?

Yes. The EULA (End User License Agreement) allows Autodesk software to be installed on a main computer and a backup computer (laptop or home).

12 How many times can a student download the product?

The installation file(s) can be downloaded as many times as you want, but each Student Community member is issued only one serial number for that version in a 13-month period. Without a serial number, the downloaded file will work for a 30-day trial period.

13 What is the turnaround time a student should expect when submitting questions to the Student Community email address?

The turnaround time is generally 24 business hours, and 72 hours on weekends and holidays.

14 I've downloaded a software title from the Student Community but haven't received a serial number. What should I do?

Your serial number is available on the Student Community site in your Profile and is also sent to you via email after download. If you still cannot find it, you may email for help at studentcommunity@autodesk.com.

15 I have a software title from the Student Community that will be expiring soon. Is it possible to get an extension so I can keep using the license?

No. Student Community members would need to download the next version or purchase a student version in order to continue to use the license beyond the 13-month time period.

16 I'm having problems downloading a software title from the Student Community. Whom should I contact for assistance?

Log in to the Student Community site and visit the Support Center, Q&A forums. Most answers can easily be found through the Support Center. If you are unable to find an answer to your question, please send an email to studentcommunity@autodesk.com.

17 I've downloaded a software title from the Student Community, but I'm receiving an error informing me that currently there are no serial numbers available, and to try back again in 30 days. What should I do?

Due to the popularity of the free* software program, sometimes we can't keep up with the demand for the serial numbers. You can still install the product and use it for 30 days in a "trial" mode. Please check back on the Student Community for serial numbers within that time by clicking the Get Serial button for your product and version. If serial number(s) are still not available, please send an email to studentcommunity@autodesk.com.

18 I have downloaded a software title from the Student Community that still has time left on the license term. Can I transfer the remaining time to another product?

No, but you can visit the Student Community site to download another product and obtain a serial number for 13 full months of use.

19 I have downloaded a software title from the Student Community, and I know the license will be expiring soon. Is it possible to purchase the product so I can keep using the license?

Yes, a select number of product licenses are available for sale to students at affordable prices. To find your local Autodesk Reseller, visit www.autodesk.com/reseller.

20 I have downloaded a software title from the Student Community and received a serial number, but it doesn't work. What should I do?

Please send an email to studentcommunity@autodesk.com, where someone can work more closely with you.

21 I've purchased a Student Version of Autodesk software, but I'm having technical problems. Where can I get technical assistance?

Log in to the Student Community and visit the Support Center, Q&A forums. If you are unable to find an answer to your question, please send an email to studentcommunity@autodesk.com.

22 What are the system requirements to run a Student Version of Autodesk products?

System requirements for a student version of a software title are the same as for a commercial version. System requirements are found on the appropriate products page at www.autodesk.com/products.

23 I have downloaded a software title from the Student Community that I no longer need. Can I sell the product to another classmate?

No, you may not sell the product, but please invite your classmates to join the Student Community and download their own free product.

24 How do I obtain an activation code for the software title I downloaded from the Student Community?

Autodesk offers online activation at www.autodesk.com/register. If you need additional activation assistance, please send email to authcodes@autodesk.com.

25 I am trying to register my product online, but the Autodesk product registration site won't recognize my Student Community login information or email address.

What should I do?

Software titles downloaded from the Student Community can be activated online. To activate online go to www.autodesk.com/register. On the Autodesk product registration site you will be prompted for a user ID and password. ***The Autodesk product registration and activation site uses a different login mechanism than the login system used for the Student Community site.*** Therefore you will need to create a new user ID and password to complete the registration process to obtain a product activation code.

26 I have a downloaded software title from the Student Community with a serial number, and I've received a message that says my activation limit has been reached. What does this mean?

You are only allowed to activate your serial number twice—once on your main computer and once on a backup computer. This message indicates that you have already activated your serial number twice.

27 I'm currently a student and have a downloaded software title and serial number from the Student Community that I may have tried to activate too many times. How can I receive an additional activation code?

You are only allowed to activate your serial number twice per the EULA—once on your main computer and once on a backup computer.

28 I've just downloaded and installed a software title from the Student Community and it says it's about to expire, but I have never received an activation code. What should I do?

This message is presented when a product has not been successfully activated and is operating in the 30-day trial period. Log in to the Student Community site, go to Software Downloads, find your product and version, and click Get Serial to obtain your serial number.
